What is Wikidata?


- free and open knowledge base of structured data
- can be expressed as linked open data
- useable by humans and machines
- editable by anyone!

Why Wikidata?

- linked open data (LOD) platform
 - low-barrier intro - does not require knowledge of LOD principles
- "linking hub" that connects to many authority files/databases
- indexable by search engines
 - way to increase access to archival collections (and other library resources!)

Planning phase: April-June 2020

- some pre-2020 planning, but not pursued at the time
- preliminary searching and experimentation with list of archival collections
- preliminary searching - not many names on Wikidata yet!
- develop preliminary data models

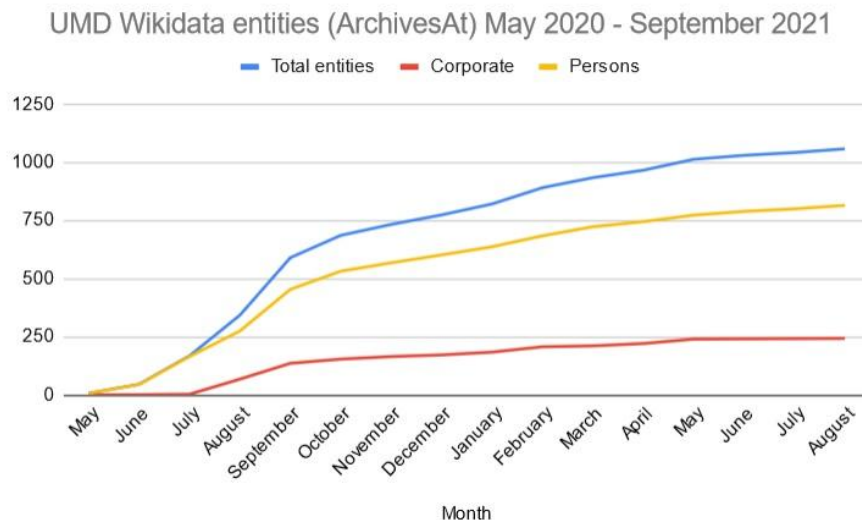

Active phase: July 2020 through summer 2021

- focused first on Labor collections
- no quotas or deadlines
- participants set own pace
- active exploration and experimentation
- membership in PCC Wikidata Pilot

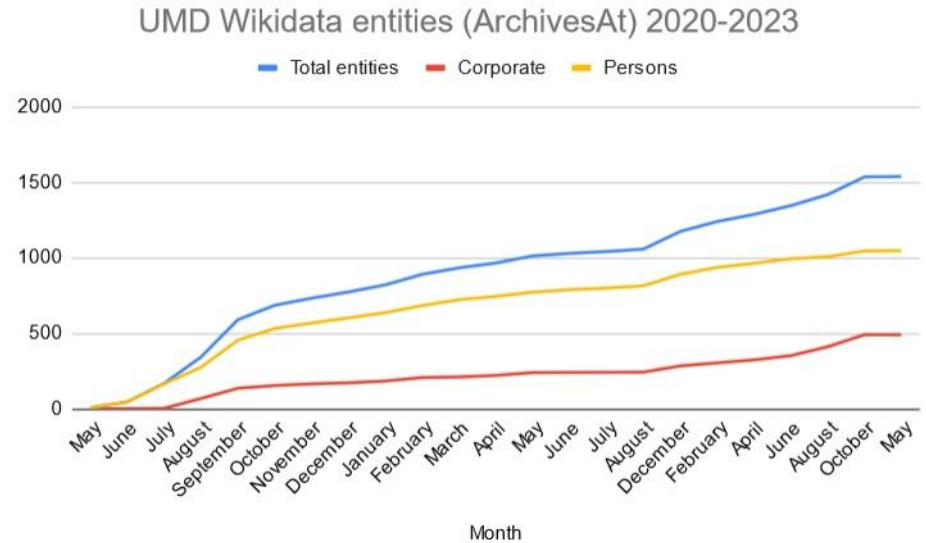


Wrap-up phase: September 2021 - September 2022

- editing slowdown in summer/fall 2021
 - straightforward items completed, remaining items complicated
 - return to campus and hybrid work
 - office renovation
 - personnel turnover
- developed comprehensive approach to UMD-related corporate names

Outcomes

- increased staff knowledge of Wikidata
- increased experience with linked data
- increased access to archival collections
- new opportunities within and without Libraries



Future planning

- adding items for other collections
 - Historic Maryland Newspapers
 - World's Fair collection
- exploring batch processing options and intersections with other systems

Benefits to the Libraries and Archive

- Increase accessibility to the Library's unique and rare collections via local authority data
- Provide greater contextual information by linking local authority data to other national and international authority files
- Support broader social justice efforts by promoting access to the diverse and multicultural collections held within the archive

Favorite Topics - History

- **History - State of Maryland, University of Maryland and National**
 - Many individuals who served the State going back to the earliest days of the colony
 - Many alumni, faculty and/or staff who provided materials documenting their time at UMD
 - Several individuals who were founders of the National Historic Preservation Trust and whose influence is still felt today in the realm of preservation
 - Including individuals who worked closely with the creation of the public broadcasting system and the Corporation for Public Broadcasting
 - Pioneering individuals in the realm of broadcasting

This should be a phrase rather than a sentence - start in lowercase and do not end in a period. Prefer terms that describe the newspaper rather than actions.

Identifiers are links and strings that can help users identify a newspaper and find instances of that newspaper in external databases and websites

Using core and recommended properties to query Wikidata

- We can use the properties we added to each item to **ask questions about our collections** in Wikidata
- Let's say we wanted a list of student newspapers at UMD and their intended audiences
- We could write a query to easily get that information in a spreadsheet format
 - We would just need to identify the properties that we're looking for.
 - In this case, that's

 - Archives at (P485) : [University of Maryland Libraries \(Q7895690\)](#)

Notice that they all contain “university student” as one audience, but many contain overlapping categories that are more specific to the individual newspaper.

Takeaways

- Wikidata is easy to use, flexible, and well-suited to library uses
- The procedure for creating newspaper items can be tailored and re-used for other projects
- Querying is an easy(ish) way to ask questions about our collections
 - The more data we add to each item, the better questions we can ask and the more answers we can collect about patterns and gaps within the Wikiprojects and UMD collections

HOW IT WORKS

Our courses use an online course management system. We use Moodle, an easy-to-use open source platform with few technical requirements beyond an internet connection and standard browser interface.

Courses are taught asynchronously (meaning that you don't have to be online at any particular time), and involve reading assignments, offline activities, and class participation.

Our strong emphasis is on interaction between the students and the instructors.

A four week course involves about fifteen hours of work (3.75 hours per week).

Our instructors are knowledgeable professionals actively engaged in the learning process, and are there to support you.

Wikidata has become a high-demand identifier hub, with considerable community buy-in and recognition as an identity reconciliation service, which makes Wikidata ideal in the implementation of identity management principles Wikidata facilitates a NACO-Lite approach that would lower the barrier to authority creation and maintenance by PCC members

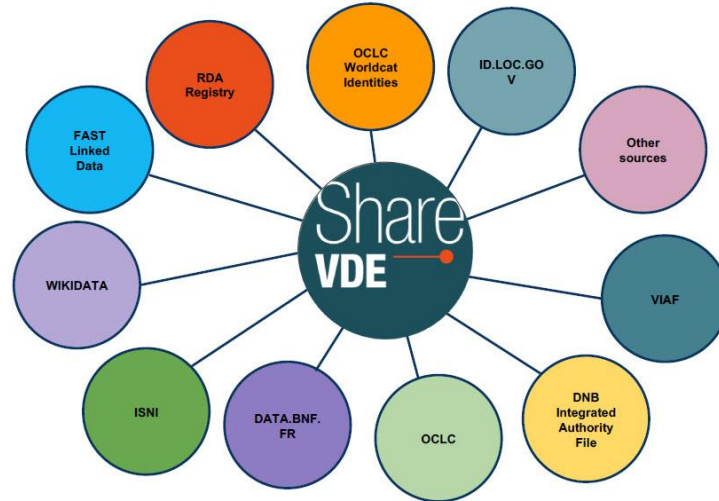
